Collection Essentials

A collection is a group of protocols and/or sites that you analyze in XXX. You may save the collection for easy application to tiles and visualizations.

- The first time you use XXX, All My Data is the only collection available. The All My Data collection includes all protocols and sites in which you have access.
- You may create as many collections as needed.
- You may add up to 200 protocols and 500 sites to each collection.
- XXX defaults to the last collection you applied during your previous XXX session.
- The selected collection is applied to the dashboard tiles and any visualizations that are opened.

Create a New Collection

You may create as many collections as needed to analyze your studies.

1. Click **New** from the Options menu to start creating a collection.

Note:

Adhoc Collection # (Unsaved) is added to the Collections drop-down list. This is how all new collections start.

- 2. Click Save As from the Options menu to give the collection a name.
- 3. Type a unique collection name in the Name box.
- 4. Click Save . The saved collection is displayed in the Collections drop-down box. You are now ready to add protocols to the collection.

Add a Protocol or Site – Using Add Function

Use the Add function when you know the protocol/site number.

- 1. Click Add.
- 2. Type the protocol/site name or number. As you type, the protocols/sites that match your entry are listed.

- 3. Select the protocol/site to be added to the collection. The selected protocol/site is displayed in the Protocols/Sites list.
 - Only one protocol/site can be selected at a time using the Add link.
 - "More..." is displayed if all protocols/sites matching your entry do not fit in the list. When clicked, the Advanced Protocol/Site Search window is displayed to make your protocol/site selection(s).



Add a Protocol or Site – Using Advanced Search

Use the Advanced Search function when using multiple search criteria and/or selecting multiple protocols/sites at one time.

Note:

Since the Clinical dashboard contains tiles that focus on sites, its Collections area provides the option to select specific sites.

- 1. Click Advanced Search.
- 2. Enter the criteria in the corresponding search field(s). If typing the criteria, press Enter to start the search.
 - Quick Search finds Protocol Numbers that *begin* with the criteria typed in the Quick Search field.
 - Criteria typed in the Protocol Number field finds protocols with that criteria *anywhere* in the protocol number.

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Note:

To remove the search criteria, delete the text in the search field(s) and press Enter.

- 3. Use the following tips to sort protocols/sites in the Advanced Search window.
 - Click a column heading to sort the data in ascending or descending order.
 - To identify protocols with or without subject level data, use the Subject Data Available drop-down list.

- Click the column selector to view the fields available for searching and sorting protocols. The column selector is used to add and remove columns from the table.
- You must add protocols to the collection before you can add sites.
- To select all active sites for a protocol within a country, click the Site Number heading to sort the sites. The site with numbers, not TBD sites will be shown first and can be easily selected.
- The Current Site Status field is commonly used for sorting.
- 4. Click the protocol and/or site row(s) to be included in your collection. As rows are selected, they are added to the Protocols/Sites list, on the left.
 - To select multiple contiguous rows, click the first protocol/site in the group, hold the **Shift** key, and click the last protocol/site in the group.
 - To select multiple non-contiguous rows, click the first protocol/site row in the group, hold the **Ctrl** key, then click additional row(s).
- 5. Click Save. The Collection Note is replaced with populated tiles based on the selected collection.

Note:

The expand > and collapse \checkmark symbols show and hide the protocol list.

Apply a Collection

- Once a collection is created, you can apply it to the dashboard tiles by selecting it from the Collections drop-down list. The tiles are updated based on the applied collection.
- A Collections drop-down list, located in the top right corner, is also available when viewing any visualization.





Edit a Collection

Collections are **automatically saved** after each change you make to them. Any change made to a collection is reflected in the dashboard tiles and any visualization that is opened.

Add Protocols/Sites

You can <u>add protocols and sites</u> to an existing collection in the same manner as when creating the collection.

Delete Protocols

Click ***** to remove the protocol or site from the collection. After removing a protocol or site, the collection is automatically saved and the tiles are updated to reflect the removal.

If you want the protocol or site in the collection after clicking **x**, you must use the <u>Add</u> or <u>Advanced Search</u> links.

Temporarily Remove Protocols/Sites

Temporary removal of protocols/sites in a collection is only applicable to dashboard tiles. Use the Filters panel to make changes to a visualization.

- Click the protocol or site number to temporarily remove them from the collection. The protocol and site numbers are struck through when temporarily removed from the collection.
- Click the number again to include them in the collection.

Copy a Collection

You can copy an existing collection and modify it to include or exclude additional protocols/sites.

- 1. Select the collection to be copied from the Collections drop-down list.
- 2. Click **Copy** on the Options drop-down list. Adhoc Collection # (Unsaved) is added to the Collections drop-down list.
- 3. Select **Save As** from the Options drop-down list and save the collection as a new name. (See the steps for saving.)
- 4. The copied collection can now be edited as needed. (<u>See the steps</u> for editing.)

Delete a Collection

You can delete collections that are no longer of use to you.

- 1. Select the collection to be deleted from the Collections drop-down list.
- 2. Click Delete on the Options drop-down list.
- 3. Click **OK** to confirm the deletion. The collection is removed from the Collections drop-down list.

Collections

The Collections area allows you to change the selected protocols and sites that are represented in the tiles and visualizations. Protocol and site selections can be saved as Collections and selected from the drop-down list. <u>See more.</u>

Ø My Dashboard

The My Dashboard link displays your custom dashboard.

- You can create this dashboard by marking tiles that are of particular interest to you.
- Tiles are added to My Dashboard by clicking $\stackrel{\textbf{i}}{\eqsim}$ in the tile Settings.

Sponsor

The Sponsor link displays the Sponsor's dashboard. This dashboard contains sponsor-specific tiles that provide key insights into selected protocols and sites.

Tiles can be hidden from the dashboard. To redisplay them, click Hidden Tiles, then click the tile name from the list.

4 Library

The Library link displays a list of all visualizations available to you.

- The Name column provides links to each visualization.
- The Collection columns indicate visualization categories such as protocol or site.
- The Help column provides links to the Visualization Guidance (VG) for the related visualization.

ۏ Help

The Help link displays the areas of support available to you.

🜀 Hidden Tiles

You can redisplay a tile by clicking Hidden Tiles, then clicking the tile name from the list.

Tiles are hidden by clicking \blacksquare in the tile Settings to hide them from view.

Related Visualizations

The Related Visualizations link displays a list of visualizations that make up the tiles shown in the currently viewed dashboard.

Sponsor

- Some tiles are made up of more than one visualizations.
- Some visualizations are not represented by a tile.

8 Settings

Hover over the Settings button to display the viewing options for a tile.



O Tile Titles

Some tiles are linked to related visualizations for further analysis of the study data. You can click the title to open the visualization. Other tiles present study and site data without linking to a visualization.

- A tile symbol is displayed to indicate the tile is linked to a visualization.
- When linked to a visualization, the tile title is blue and underlined.
- Hover over the tile title to show the related visualization name.
- Non-linked tile titles are black and are not underlined.

0 Tiles

The tiles shown on a dashboard provide you with a quick overview of key study data that will assist you in managing your studies. <u>See more.</u>

- Some tiles are linked to related visualizations for further analysis of study data. Other tiles are not linked to a visualization.
- Some visualizations in the Library are not represented by a tile.
- Tiles represent data pulled from the associated data source(s).
- Tiles cannot be modified or rearranged.
- Tiles can be hidden. To redisplay a tile, click Hidden Tiles, then click the tile name from the list.
